China in Brief

The People's Republic of China has the second largest economy in the world after the US with a GDP of over US\$ 7 trillion (2007) when measured on a purchasing power parity (PPP) basis. In November 2007, it became the third largest in the world after the US and Japan with a nominal GDP of US\$ 3.42 trillion (2007) when measured in exchange-rate terms. China has been



the fastest-growing major nation for the past quarter of a century with an average annual GDP growth rate above 10%. China's per capita income has grown at an average annual rate of more than 8% over the last three decades drastically reducing poverty. The country's per capita income is at about US\$ 2,000 at nominal exchange rates and US\$ 7,800 in PPP terms in 2006, according to the IMF.

The country is one of the world's largest producers of a number of industrial and mineral products, including cotton cloth, tungsten, and antimony, and is an important producer of cotton yarn, coal, crude oil, and a number of other products. Its mineral resources are probably among the richest in the world but are only partially developed. China has acquired some highly sophisticated production facilities through trade and also has built a number of advanced engineering plants capable of manufacturing an increasing range of sophisticated equipment, including satellites.

Industry and construction account for about 48% of China's GDP. Around 8% of the total manufacturing output in the world comes from China itself. China ranks third worldwide in industrial output. Major industries include mining and ore processing; iron and steel; aluminum; coal; machinery; armaments; textiles and apparel; petroleum; cement; chemical; fertilizers; food processing; automobiles and other transportation equipment including rail cars and locomotives, ships, and aircraft; consumer products including footwear, toys, and electronics; telecommunications and information technology. China has become a preferred destination for the relocation of global manufacturing facilities. Its strength as an export platform has contributed to incomes and employment in China. The state-owned sector still accounts for about 40% of GDP. In recent years, authorities have been giving greater attention to the management of state assets - both in the financial market as well as among state-owned-enterprises - and progress has been noteworthy.

India-China Bilateral Trade and the emerging opportunities

Trade relations between the two countries have been on the increase. At present the balance of trade is in favour of China. India's exports to China were to the tune of US\$ 8,287.48 million in the year 2006-07 and imports from China to India was US\$ 17,447.01 million. Thus the total trade was US\$ 25,734.49 million.

Engineering goods scope in China

China ranks first as an importer of engineering goods and machinery in the world with imports in this category reaching US\$ 335.30 billion in 2007. China mainly imports machinery and engineering goods from Europe, Japan, South Korea and Taiwan. In 2007, to meet the demand of machine tools, China imported products worth US\$ 9.72 billion. Indian engineering industry is yet to tap this market largely on account of lack of understanding about Indian engineering industry in China.

China today is also a major importer of machinery items. There are niche areas where we can promote our exports to meet Chinese demand. Many Chinese companies are interested to source vendors and parts from India either for projects in China or for projects in third countries. Products that are looked to be sourced from India are :

Pressure Vessels, Pressure Vessels Internals, Air Coolers, Heat Exchangers, Storage Tanks, Furnaces, Boilers, Cooling Towers, Pumps, Compressors and Boilers, Agitators and Mixers, Fans, Turbines, Gears, Electric Motors, Valves, Pipes, Fittings, Flanges and Ring Joints, Transmitters and Converters, Control Room Instruments, Control Valves, Safety Valves, Instrument Cables and Tubes, Electric Cables, Transformers, Medium Voltage Panels, Low Voltage Panels.

Share of Small and Medium Industries in total exports is also growing at a steady rate. Out of the above mentioned items there are various items manufactured by Indian small and medium industries that have good export potential for the Chinese market.

This project is under Market Access Initiative (MAI) Scheme of the Government of India. Therefore, the cost of participation is highly subsidized. In fact, the cost of direct participation is Euro 280 per sq. mtr. However, no separate subsidy under MDA is available for this event.

**Overseas Market Information****UAE****Major contract signed by the UAE Firm in UK**

DP World signed a £ 400 million (Dh 2.7 billion) contract to build the first phase of a new port at London Gateway. This is the first major contract to be awarded in the £1.5 billion project, due to be built over the next 10 to 15 years. The contract is over five years, and will see the construction of the first phase of the port's quay providing three berths and over 1.2 kilometres of quay in a joint venture between Laing O'Rourke and Dredging International. The new port will eventually handle 3.5 million TEU (twenty foot equivalent units), providing a much needed increase in capacity for the UK's container terminals.

UAE Steel Industry growing Rapidly

In its latest market research report, UAE Steel Industry Analysis has indicated that UAE steel industry is expected to grow by more than 200 per cent from the current levels by 2012. The UAE is one of the most promising steel markets in the GCC region, where production reached 1.7 million tonnes in 2006. A construction boom, cheap and reliable gas and energy supply besides geographical positioning are the major driving forces for the steel industry in the UAE. The report assesses the present status of the steel industry in the UAE and GCC region, and identifies investment opportunities. It says total steel production in the region reached 15.65 million tonnes in 2006, while that in the UAE touched 1.7 million tonnes and is expected to grow 235 per cent by 2012. Steel consumption in the UAE is highly influenced by the boom in construction and infrastructure development. The value of construction contracts awarded by the end of 2007 is estimated at \$ 32.8 billion (Dh 120.47 bn) as compared to \$ 16.1 bn at the end of 2005. There is a huge capacity expansion in the pipeline, which will result in economies of scale for steel producers in the country. The report added that economic growth and energy resources (oil and gas) are also helping the UAE steel industry to grow rapidly.



Agreement on construction of a Fertilizer Complex in Uzbekistan

International Petroleum Investment Company (IPIC) of Abu Dhabi and Borealis signed a MoU with Uzbekistan's State Joint-Stock Company (Uzkimyosanoat) to conduct a feasibility study for the construction of a world-scale Fertilizer complex in Uzbekistan. Uzkimyosanoat consists of 12 chemical plants, 13 distributing companies, two engineering and scientific research institutes and a logistics company. Scheduled to start up in 2012, this would be the largest plant nutrients complex in Central Asia and would comprise Ammonia Unit and Urea Plant.

 - “2(a) The supplies from DTA to EOU/EHTP/STP units must be utilized by them for production of goods/services and may include raw material, components, consumables, packing materials, capital goods, spares, material handling equipment etc. on which CST has been actually paid by the EOU/EHTP/STP.”
 - “2(b) While dealing with the application for reimbursement of CST, the Development Commissioner or the designated officer of the EHTP/STP shall see, inter alia, that the purchases are essential for the production of goods/ services by the units.”
2. Clause (a) of undertaking and declaration below Annexure 1 in Appendix 14-I-I is also replaced by the following :
 - “a) The goods for which the claim has been made are meant for utilization/production of goods/services of the EOU/ EHTP/STP unit and will be utilized only in our factory and we shall not divert or dispose off the material procured without obtaining prior permission of the concerned Development Commissioner.”

In case of supply by a DTA Unit to a SEZ Unit /SEZ Developer/Co-Developer, an exporter may apply for credit for exports made in freely convertible currency or payment made from foreign currency account of SEZ Unit/ SEZ Developer/Co-Developer. In addition, the exporter shall also be entitled for DEPB benefit in case payment is made in Indian Rupees by SEZ Developer/Co-Developer for supplies received w.e.f 10.2.2006.”

Attention is invited to paragraph 4.5 and 4.56 of HBP v.1 to be read with the Public Notice No. 34 dated 27.6.08, wherein it has stated that transfer of any duty free material imported or procured against actual user DFIA shall not be transferred to units located in areas covered by the Central Excise Notifications as mentioned in the aforesaid Public Notice. Representations have been received from trade and industry to clarify whether the restriction is applicable for DFIA's with 'No BG/LUT' endorsement or endorsement of transferability.

The matter has been examined and accordingly it is clarified that the restrictions on such transfer is limited to advance authorization and DFIA Scheme issued and operated under Actual User condition. Once transferability is endorsed on the DFIA, transfer of the imported/ domestically procured input(s) against such DFIA shall not be covered by the restrictive clause of the aforesaid Public Notice.
