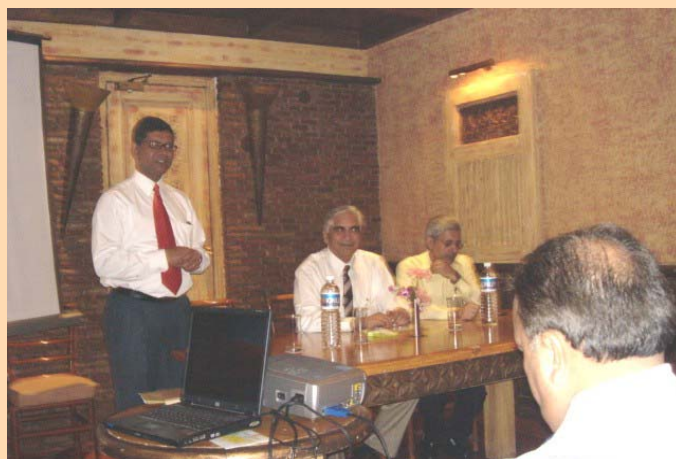

Chairman's Pen




My dear fellow exporters,

The Annual Supplement to the Foreign Trade Policy announced by the Government on April 19, 2007 had introduced a new para 5.8.6 in Chapter 5 of Handbook of Procedures Vol. 1 stating that in case of an existing EO under EPCG scheme, a fresh EPCG authorization can only be issued provided the average of last obligation has been maintained. The Council had written to the DGFT on April 26th that for new units without any previous exports, but require fresh authorization, for instance, for infrastructure requirements to begin their export production activity, the new para 5.8.6 is a stumbling block and will hinder production of such units. I am happy to state that the DGFT has now addressed this concern and by its Public Notice No. 53(RE-2007)/2004-2009 dated 27th September 2007 now deleted para 5.8.6 under the EPCG scheme.

This apart, the appreciation of the Rupee has clearly affected the exports growth and while the Commerce & Industry Minister has stated that it will not be possible for the Government to calibrate the rupee, it will help exporters with a higher refund of both state and central taxes. The Council has been advocating the need for exemption based system rather than a refund based system and has given the list of all state level taxes that needs to be exempted for exporters. This apart, the Council has stressed the need for giving an input credit in the VAT chain for CST paid for inter-state purchase of raw materials by exporters as has been done by the state of Gujarat. The Council is also working on a paper to look at the best practices being followed by different states of the country so that other states can also adopt such practices.

The Council is also seeking feedback from eminent experts and economist on the benefits of full capital account convertibility for small and medium scale exporters and whether we should recommend the full float of the Rupee to the Government. We are also in the process of drawing up suggestions for the EXIM policy for 2008/09 and I would request you to send your suggestions to us at the earliest.

Accordingly, EEPC is pleased to announce one of its major events – INDEE, St. Petersburg – to be held in Russia at Lenexpo Fair Grounds in Gavan, St. Petersburg, Russia during 11-14 March, 2008. This is a major step forward to enter into the Russian market.

Council is organizing this **INDEE** in association with **Petersburg Technical Fair**, organized by M/s. RESTEC Exhibition Company, established in 1990 and is one of Russia's top five exhibition companies. RESTEC holds over 100 events including about 20 Russian collective expositions at the international exhibitions in Germany, France, UK, Italy, Finland, Sweden and other countries on the annual basis. RESTEC's exhibition activity in Russia have been awarded by Russian Federal Ministries.

Petersburg Technical Fair is international specialised exhibitions held simultaneously under one roof – Metallurgy, Casting, Tools, Metalworking technology, Compressors, Pumps, Valves and Bearings.

Over 300 companies from 16 worldwide countries participated in Petersburg Technical Fair during March 2007. More than **10,500 visitors** from **150 Russian Cities** and **12 Countries** visited this mega event.

Council has booked **2500 sq. mtrs.** of space in **Hall No. 8A** of Lenexpo Fair Grounds at St. Petersburg.

India has been declared "Partner Country" at this Exhibition.

About Russia

Russia ended 2006 with its 8th straight year of growth averaging 6.7% annually since the financial crises of 1998. Although high oil prices and a relatively cheap Rouble initially drove this growth, since 2003-04 consumer demand and, more recently, investment have played a significant role. A number of important reforms in the areas of tax, banking, labour and land codes have raised investor confidence which led to surge in FDI to 14.6 billion US\$ in 2005.

India and Russia :

Russia and India enjoy long standing historic relations. Immediately prior to the collapse of the Soviet Union, India was the largest trade partner. However, after its disintegration, total trade between India and Russia dropped drastically. Since 2001-02 there has been no growth in India's overall export to Russia. However, there has been a surge in import from Russia to India. Since 2003-04, India's trade balance with Russia is negative and on the rise.

In the engineering sector a growth is observed in export from India to Russia – 68% in 2005-06 over 2004-05. The major areas of growth are :

- Manufactures of Metals;
- Transport Equipments;
- Items of Iron and Steel.
- Machinery and Instruments;
- Machine Tools;

In view of the present economic boom in Russia, imports to Russia are increasing significantly. In order to increase India's share in Russia's global imports, it is being planned to organize an exclusive Indian Engineering Exhibition (INDEE) in St. Petersburg.

Travel and Hotel Accommodation

Council will assist participants in locating suitable air lines and hotels at St. Petersburg, Russia at negotiated rates through accredited Travel Agents. However, participants are free to stay and travel through their own agencies.

Visa

Council will issue a recommendation letter for the representatives of the company participating in INDEE for the grant of visa to visit St. Petersburg for the show. EEPC will not give any guarantee for the grant of visa to any participant, as this is the sole discretion of the Russian High Commission in India.

MDA Grant

All eligible participants will be entitled to MDA grant under Focus CIS Programme of the Ministry of Commerce, Government of India as per the MDA Guidelines effective from April 01, 2006.

Assistance would be permissible on travel expenses by Air in Economy Excursion Class fare and/or charges of built up furnished stall subject to an upper ceiling of Rs. 1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Fifty Thousand only).

Further, eligibility for MDA grant is subject to exporting companies having FOB value of exports up to Rs. 15 crores in the preceding year, having completed 12 month membership with EEPC with regular filing of returns and fulfilling other conditions, details of which can be obtained from respective Regional Offices of EEPC.

Clarification regarding issue of Export House Status Certificate by Regional Offices of DGFT.

Attention is invited to para 3.2.1 of Handbook of Procedures which provides that application shall be filed with jurisdictional Regional Authority/Development Commissioner. However in cases where export performance of EOUs/SEZs is clubbed together with company or firm/Group Company in DTA, the same will be considered by jurisdictional Regional Authority only.

2. The issue has been examined in detail and it is decided that the jurisdictional Regional Offices of DGFT would examine, consider and issue Export House Status Certificate for STPI units, as jurisdictional Development Commissioner issues the same for SEZ and EOU units alone.

Classification of Digital LCD/Flat Panel Monitor - Admissibility of Notification benefits - reg.

It has been represented by the trade and industry association that certain difficulties have been faced in classification of monitors for use with Automatic Data Processing (ADP) machine and consequent import duty exemption benefits. Doubts have been expressed by field formations as to whether 'LCD or Flat Panel Monitors, if used along with ADP Machines would be classifiable as 'ADP Monitor' and whether exemption from Customs duty vide Sl.No.17 of Notification No. 24/2005-Cus dated 1.3.2005 would be admissible.

2. The issue was examined in the Board. Monitors used along with ADP machines were classified till 31.12.2006, under heading 8471 of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975. Due to HS 2007 changes brought into effect from 1.1.2007, such monitors are presently classifiable under sub heading 8528 40. All types of monitors and projectors which are solely or principally used with an ADP machine is covered under the sub headings 8528 41(Cathode Ray Tube Monitors), 8528 51(Other types) and 8528 61(Projectors) and are extended with exemption of customs duty vide Sl.No.17 of notification No. 24/2005-Customs dated 1.3.2005. Further, television or video monitors were classifiable earlier under heading 8528. Presently these monitors used as Television or Video reception apparatus are classified under sub heading 8528 71 or 8528 72 as the case may be, and are not eligible for the aforesaid exemption.

3. This issue was also deliberated at the Conference of Chief Commissioners' on Tariff and Allied Matters, wherein it was decided that the Board may issue guidelines on the basis of assessment practice that is being followed by Customs Commissionerate, Aircargo, Mumbai to distinguish 'computer monitors' from that of monitors for use with TV / Video and for classifying the goods under 8528 41 or 8528 51 (earlier classifiable under CTH 8471). However, to ensure uniformity, it was decided that Board could issue a circular in this regard.

4. Accordingly the technical features distinguishing the computer monitors from the other types of Television/video monitors are enclosed. These could be used by the officers of the field formation as guidance for assessment, examination of the said goods for determining its proper classification and extension of the notification benefit.

G.S.R.(E) In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-Section (1) of Section 25 of the Customs Act, 1962 (52 of 1962), the Central Government, being satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest so to do, hereby exempts goods of the description as specified in column (3) of the Table appended hereto and falling under the Heading, Sub-heading or Tariff Item of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 (51 of 1975) as specified in the corresponding entry in column (2) of the said Table, when imported into India from the Republic of Chile, from so much of that portion of the applied rate of duty of customs leviable thereon as is specified in the corresponding entry in column (4) of the said Table :

Provided that the importer proves to the satisfaction of the Deputy Commissioner of Customs or Assistant Commissioner of Customs, as the case may be, that the goods in respect of which the benefit of this exemption is claimed are of the origin of the Republic of Chile, in accordance with provisions of the Determination of Origin of Goods under the Preferential Trading Agreement between the Republic of India and the Republic of Chile Rules, 2007, published in the Notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue), No. 84/2007-Customs (N.T.), dated the 17th August, 2007.

Explanation. - For the purposes of this Notification, "applied rate of duty" means the standard rate of duty specified in the First Schedule to the said Customs Tariff Act, 1975 in respect of the goods specified in the said Table, read with any other Notification for the time being in force, issued in respect of such goods under Sub-Section (1) of Section 25 of the Customs Act, 1962 (52 of 1962).

Exim Bank extends US\$ 100 Million Credit Line to Nepal
