## Chairman's Pen



*My dear fellow exporters,*


*The Business Standard on September 12, 2007, reported that the Competition Commission of India (CCI) is "irked at the shipping lines forming cartels to fix freight rates". In a letter to the Shipping Ministry, the CCI has pointed out that the India-Pakistan-Bangladesh-Ceylon Conference (IPBCC), which is one of the oldest shipping conferences in the world, controls about 75% of the traffic between India and Europe needs to abide by the provisions of India's new competition law, the Competition Act, 2002, since the new Act provides for no exemption for Shipping Conferences. The Report further notes that CCI Member Shri Vinod Dhall has "warned" the shipping lines by saying that the penalties for cartels are particularly severe under the Indian law.*

*If true, this is indeed good news and something that the Council has been drawing the attention of the CCI as well as the Ministry of Shipping for sometime now. Further, apart from jacking up the freight rates beyond what is required by market conditions, freight rates in India seem to vary from region to region. The Ocean Freight Rates from Kolkata port, for instance, for shipments to European and Gulf destinations have increased between 60%-150% between April 2007 and September 2007. This has been further compounded by scaling down of the loadability tonnage. It needs to be noted that for engineering exports, unlike other commodity exports, freight rates constitute nearly 25%-30% of total cost of shipment and hence rent seeking in freight rates can deliver a death knell to the competitiveness of our engineering exports. This is more so at a time when conditions are most unfavourable for undertaking exports.*

*EEPC has been suggesting to the Government the need for a National Shipping Regulator in lines of TRAI and IRDA in the telecom and insurance sector as well as strengthening the Shipping Corporation of India so that it can at least handle 5% of total cargo from India and can have some impact on the making of freight rates in the shipping industry in the country.*

*As I had mentioned last week, the Council is in the process of drawing up a fresh list of items that can be included in the list of items that can be exported to Pakistan and I would urge members to suggest specific tariff lines which the Council can recommend to the Government for inclusion in the Indo-Pakistan Trade List. The Council has also submitted to the Government its Pre-Budget suggestions for the next fiscal year and will be now forwarding its suggestions with regard to the monetary and credit policies to the RBI. I urge you to send your suggestions to the Council so that they can be incorporated for onward transmission to RBI.*

## About Russia

Russia ended 2006 with its 8th straight year of growth averaging 6.7% annually since the financial crises of 1998. Although high oil prices and a relatively cheap Rouble initially drove this growth, since 2003-04 consumer demand and, more recently, investment have played a significant role. A number of important reforms in the areas of tax, banking, labour and land codes have raised investor confidence which led to surge in FDI to 14.6 billion US\$ in 2005.

## India and Russia :

Russia and India enjoy long standing historic relations. Immediately prior to the collapse of the Soviet Union, India was the largest trade partner. However, after its disintegration, total trade between India and Russia dropped drastically. Since 2001-02 there has been no growth in India's overall export to Russia. However, there has been a surge in import from Russia to India. Since 2003-04, India's trade balance with Russia is negative and on the rise.

In the engineering sector a growth is observed in export from India to Russia – 68% in 2005-06 over 2004-05. The major areas of growth are :

- Manufactures of Metals;
- Transport Equipments;
- Items of Iron and Steel.
- Machinery and Instruments;
- Machine Tools;

In view of the present economic boom in Russia, imports to Russia are increasing significantly. In order to increase India's share in Russia's global imports, it is being planned to organize an exclusive Indian Engineering Exhibition (INDEE) in St. Petersburg.

EEPC will not give any guarantee for the grant of visa to any participant, as this is the sole discretion of the Russian High Commission in India.

## MDA Grant

All eligible participants will be entitled to MDA grant under Focus CIS Programme of the Ministry of Commerce, Government of India as per the MDA Guidelines effective from April 01, 2006.

Assistance would be permissible on travel expenses by Air in Economy Excursion Class fare and/or charges of built up furnished stall subject to an upper ceiling of Rs. 1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Fifty Thousand only).

Further, eligibility for MDA grant is subject to exporting companies having FOB value of exports up to Rs. 15 crores in the preceding year, having completed 12 month membership with EEPC with regular filing of returns and fulfilling other conditions, details of which can be obtained from respective Regional Offices of EEPC.

## EEPC Invites Participation at Multi-Product Engineering Delegation to Algeria and Morocco (18 - 23 November, 2007)

The Council is pleased to announce the fielding of a Multi-Product Engineering Delegation to Algeria and Morocco during 18th to 23rd November, 2007.

### Algeria

Algeria is running substantial trade surpluses and building up record foreign exchange reserves. Real GDP has risen due to higher oil output and increased Government spending.

India's Engineering Export to Algeria is increasing in a decent proportion during last 3 years. Our exports during 2005-06 was US\$174.16 million against US\$151.63, showing an increase of 14.86% over the performance during 2004-05, whereas our exports during 2006-07 was US\$246.96 million registering a growth of 41.80% over the performance during 2005-06. Although India's engineering exports to Algeria have shown a continuous growth during last 3 years, its share in the overall imports of engineering goods into Algeria remains 1.5% approximately. It shows that there is much more potential for increasing export of engineering goods from India to Algeria.

### Morocco

Morocco is a fairly stable economy with continuous growth over the past half-a-century. It is considered liberal economy governed by the laws of supply and demand. The economic system of the country presents several facets. It is characterized by a large opening towards the outside.

Bilateral trade between India and Morocco was to the tune of US\$583.88 million during 2005-06 showing an increase of 23.02% over previous year and the figures for 2006-07(April-December) touched US\$500.00 million. As far as India's engineering export to Morocco is concerned, it is showing an increase of 36.47% during 2005-06 over the performance in previous year and 23.00 % increase during 2006-07 over the performance during 2005-06. In spite of continuous growth in India's engineering export to Morocco, our share remains less than one percent i.e. 0.63% of total engineering imports into Morocco. Hence, there is good scope for enhancing India's engineering export to Morocco.

**UAE**

Abu Dhabi Water and Electricity Authority (ADWEA) signed a contract to build a \$2.8 billion power and water desalination plant with UK's International Power and Japan's Marubeni Corp. The Fujairah 2 power plant will produce 2,000 megawatts of power and around 130 million gallons per day of water and is expected to start up in 2010. IP's equity investment in the project will be \$112 million. The project funding will be 80 percent debt and 20 percent equity. The plant will be 60 percent-owned by ADWEA and Abu Dhabi National Energy Co., Spiers said. IP and Marubeni will each own 20 percent stakes. ADWEA forecasts that it requires around 1,500 to 2,000 MW of new capacity per year over the next 15 years to meet rapidly growing demand from a petrodollar-fuelled economic boom. Abu Dhabi's power generation capacity will edge up to 8,367 MW by the end of 2007, up from 8,312 MW at the end of last year. The total includes power from an existing generation plant in the emirate of Fujairah which supplies Abu Dhabi. Water capacity will rise to 629 million gallons of water per year by the end of the year. The Fujairah plant will be Abu Dhabi's sixth independent power and water plant (IWPP).

A consortium headed by Dubai-based Kampac Oil Company signed a \$1.6 billion (Dh 5.8 billion) contract for a railway project in western Ghana. The contract involves the construction of 800 km of new railway line and the rehabilitation of 400 km of existing line. The construction will begin in December.

European aerospace group EADS and France's Thales won a \$1.66 billion contract to build and launch two satellites for Abu Dhabi. According to Waleed al-Mokarrab al-Muhairi, Chief Operating Officer of Abu Dhabi Government Investment Agency Mubadala Development Co., told reporters that EADS and Thales Alenia Space, a Thales controlled venture with Italy's Finmeccanica, will launch the first satellite in 2010.

**Procedure to be followed for deciding eligibility and level of cut in entitlement on applications filed beyond the due date subsequent to Public Notice No.16 dated 10.7.2007**

References have been received from various Regional Authorities regarding the procedure to be followed for deciding the eligibility and the level of cut in entitlement to be imposed on applications received after due date subsequent to Public Notice No.16 dated 10.7.2007.

2. The matter has been examined and it is clarified that the amended provisions of Para 9.3 of Handbook of Procedures Vol. I shall be applied in the following manner :

- (1) Applications which have not been submitted earlier and are now eligible with late cut may be considered with 2% or 5% cut, as the case may be in terms of amended para 9.3 of HBP.
- (2) (i) All time barred, pending or rejected applications which were filed after six months from the expiry of prescribed last date of submission of application, but are now within 12 months of the expiry of last date of submission of application should be processed with 5% late cut.  
(ii) In all pending cases filed within six months from the last date of submission with 10% cut, the entitlement should be issued with 2% cut.  
(iii) Similarly in all cases where entitlement was issued after 10.7.2007, requests for enhancement be considered depending on the 2% or as the case may be, 5% cut to be applied.

However, all the cases should be processed only after obtaining/submission of prescribed fees for the revised entitlement.

- (3) Those cases, where benefit has already been granted with applicable late cut etc. on or before 10.07.2007, shall not be re-opened and no request for enhancement etc. will be considered.

- (i) While obtaining RCMC, an exporter has to declare his main line of business in the application. The exporter is required to obtain RCMC from the Council which is concerned with the product of his main line of business.
- (ii) Irrespective of para (i) above, a status holder has the option to obtain RCMC from Federation of Indian Export Organisation (FIEO).
- (iii) In case an export product is not covered by any Export Promotion Council/Commodity Board, etc. RCMC in respect thereof is to be obtained from FIEO.

Provided that where the assessee is an individual or proprietary firm or partnership firm, the service tax shall be paid to the credit of the Central Government by the 6th day of the month if the duty is deposited electronically through internet banking, or, in any other case, the 5th day of the month, as the case may be, immediately following the quarter in which the payments are received, towards the value of taxable services :

Provided further that notwithstanding the time of receipt of payment towards the value of services, no service tax shall be payable for the part or whole of the value of services, which is attributable to services provided during the period when such services were not taxable :

Provided also that the service tax on the value of taxable services received during the month of March, or the quarter ending in March, as the case may be, shall be paid to the credit of the Central Government by the 31st day of March of the calendar year.”.
