
The Southern Region Export Award Presentation Function for the year 2004-05 was held at Chennai on 14th December, 2006. Prof. K. Anbazhagan, Hon'ble Minister for Finance, Government of Tamil Nadu was the Chief Guest and presented the awards to meritorious exporters. He informed that VAT is being implemented in Tamil Nadu from 1st January, 2007 onwards and it would help the traders. On this occasion, Shri M. Saikumar, I.A.S., Additional Export Commissioner & Zonal Joint Director General of Foreign Trade delivered the keynote address. He said that for the first time, the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, have gone beyond export-import and geared the Foreign Trade Policy towards increasing employment generation and expansion of manufacturing activities.

Council's Eastern Region also concluded its Export Award Function for 2004-05 on 18th December in Kolkata. Shri Nirupam Sen, Hon'ble Minister for Commerce & Industry, Government of West Bengal presented awards to meritorious exporters. In his address he said that the State Government will try to revive its board of trade to promote exports from the state, which has become non-functional for many years. He also informed that the Central Government has also given in-principle clearance for the proposed single product SEZ project in the state. Issues like late refund of VAT to export houses, which are not 100% Export Oriented Units were also raised on this occasion.

The Union Ministry of Steel has constituted a Steel Price Monitoring Committee (SPMC) constituting the members from the user industry, top management of producers and ministry representatives. The committee is expected to monitor and analyse prices and make a note on any artificial escalation of prices.

I wish all of you Merry Christmas and a very happy New Year. May the coming year be very bright and prosperous to all of you.

EEPC is pleased to announce taking part in **FERROFORMA 2007** to be held at Bilbao Exhibition Centre, Bilbao, Spain from 7th March to 10th March, 2007.

FERROFORMA 2007 will bring together manufacturers, distributors and trade professionals for all kinds of industries and general usages. There is a tremendous flow of serious trade visitors at this Expo. In the last FERROFORMA 25,000 visitors visited at the Bilbao Exhibition Centre. The total number of exhibitors, 53% of participation was international, representing a trend over time growth of 19%.

Economy & Indo-Spanish Trade

Today, the economy of Spain is the fifth largest in Europe, accounting for around 9% of EU output. Per capita income, at 78% of the EU average is among the lowest in the EU, although it is well ahead of Ireland, Portugal and Greece. Spain's main trading partners are France, Germany and Italy.

Spain is emerging as an important trading partner of India. India's total exports to Spain in 2005-06 were worth US\$ 1562.56 million, of which exports of engineering goods were at a level of US\$ 227.86 million, indicating a share of 14.58%. India's total imports from Spain in 2005-06 were US\$ 576.31 million, of which US\$ 272.22 million were engineering items.

Manufactures of metals, transport equipment, primary & semi-finished iron & steel and machinery & instruments (in order of importance) formed 94% of total exports of engineering goods from India to Spain in 2005-06.

INDIA ENGINEERING CENTER (IEC) at Johannesburg, South Africa

Strategically located on the major world trade routes, South Africa has always been a business attraction for countries in the world over. A highly advanced infrastructure has virtually made South Africa the gateway to the entire sub-Saharan Africa. It is often compared to the Europe for its economic activities. Business opportunities between India and South Africa are immense and over the last few years, there has been enormous leap in the bilateral trade.

Keeping in view the business scenario, Council is launching an “**India Engineering Center**” (IEC) – a multi-purpose outlet of Indian engineering exporters under MAI Scheme of the Ministry of Commerce, Government of India. The Centre will be located at the THEBE House, 166 Jan Smuts Avenue, Rosebank, Johannesburg, South Africa. India Engineering Center will have the following facilities to benefit its members :

- Showroom Facility for Display of Products
- Warehousing Facility for Storing the Goods
- Distribution Center
- Marketing Support – Participation in Trade Fairs and Advertisements.

Showroom Facility

Showroom of IEC will be an exhibition of goods of participating companies all the year round. This will facilitate the Indian companies to invite their buyers in and around South Africa to the Showroom to look and satisfy themselves on the various aspects connected with quality and specifications of the goods. The Showroom is located at the premier location in Johannesburg with the space of 500 sq. mtrs. The participating company will be provided one standard display window containing the following :

- Area of 1 mtr. x 1 mtr.
- Fascia of the company
- One podium for display of products
- One catalogue holder (A4 size)

Depending on the product, instead of podium, pegboard or other type of platform will be made available. However, at the time of registration, participants will have to declare a list of products to be displayed in the window. Changes of product in the window is permissible within this declared list. Any extra cost on booth customisation will have to be borne by the participants.

The participating companies may use this facility as their own office in Johannesburg and may mention the address in their marketing communications, which will make their organization presence felt in the African markets.

The participating company in the Showroom will give an undertaking to EEPC to abide by the Showroom norms.

The Council will also organize Buyer-Seller Meets of participants with their African counterparts. Representatives of participating Indian companies will be free to join the BSM. These activities will further enhance the marketability of the products of participants of IEC.

The Council will identify Trade Fairs in South Africa and other African countries for the product groups of IEC participants. Council will organize an Information Booth in these Fairs to popularize "India Engineering Center" as source of supply and also furnish details on competence of participating companies.

ATA Carnet for Temporary Duty Free Exportation & Importation of Goods

What is an ATA Carnet?

The ATA Carnet is an international Customs document that a traveller may use temporarily to import certain goods into a country without having to engage in the Customs formalities usually required for the importation of goods, and without having to pay duty or value-added taxes on the goods.

The United States allows for the temporary importation of commercial samples, professional equipment and certain advertising materials by a non-resident individual.

Carnets are a security that participating countries accept as a guarantee against the payment of Customs duties that may become due on goods temporarily imported under a Carnet and not exported as required. "ATA" stands for the combined French and English words "Admission Temporaire-Temporary Admission."

Why use an ATA Carnet?

The ATA Carnet simplifies the Customs formalities involved in temporarily importing goods into the US and other countries. Without a Carnet it would be necessary to go through the Customs procedures established in each country for the temporary admission of goods. The Carnet allows the business traveller to use a single document for clearing certain categories of goods through Customs in several different countries. It may be used for unlimited exits from and entries into the US and participating foreign countries during the one-year period of validity. They are accepted as the entry document and satisfy the importer's obligation to post a security in more than 87 countries.

Why not use Temporary Importation under Bond?

Foreign importers who choose to use a TIB to temporarily enter goods into the United States must file either Customs Form (CF) 3461, "Entry/Immediate Delivery," or 7501, "Entry Summary" to clear their shipment. This usually necessitates leaving the passenger terminal and going to the Cargo Entry Branch office, or having a Customs broker do your legwork for you. The importer will also need to secure a bond from a licensed surety. No Forms, other than the Carnet, need to be filed for goods entered under an ATA Carnet.

What are the Importer's Obligations?

A Carnet holder is obligated to present the goods and Carnet to Customs to prove exportation. Failure to prove exportation on either a TIB or a Carnet subjects the importer to liquidated damages equal to 110 per cent of the duty and import tax. Goods imported under either a TIB or a Carnet may not be offered for sale.

Who issues ATA Carnets?

Domestic associations in participating countries that are members of the International Bureau of Chambers of Commerce issue Carnets to residents to be used abroad. The United States Council for International Business <http://www.uscib.org> (USCIB) has been designated by the US Customs Service as the United States issuing and guaranteeing organization. A fee is charged by the Council for its service. The guaranteeing organization is held liable for the payment of liquidated damages if the Carnet holder, such as the importer, fails to comply with Customs regulations.

How long is an ATA Carnet valid for?

An ATA Carnet is valid for one year from the date of its issuance. Merchandise listed on an ATA Carnet can be imported to and exported from any of the member countries as many times as needed during the one-year life of the Carnet.

What goods may be entered under an ATA Carnet?

Commercial samples, professional equipment and advertising material can be imported into the United States by a non-resident.

Other countries permit the use of a Carnet to import the above materials and other categories of goods such as :

- Ordinary goods such as computers, tools, cameras and video equipment, industrial machinery, automobiles, gems and jewellery, and wearing apparel.
- Extraordinary items, for example, Van Gogh's self-portrait, circus animals, jets, band instruments, satellites, human skulls, and the New York Philharmonic's equipment.

What does a ATA Carnet not cover?

Merchandise not covered by the three above listed categories of goods are not eligible for importation into the US by Carnet. In addition, merchandise within those three categories intended for sale or sale on approval cannot be entered on a Carnet – it must be entered as a regular Customs entry.



What happens if the goods are not exported?

If the holder of an ATA Carnet sells, donates or otherwise disposes of any of the goods listed on the Carnet, the issuing organization will be required to pay liquidated damages equal to 100 per cent of the import duties and taxes. That organization in turn will attempt to collect these moneys from the holder of the Carnet who violated the terms. In some cases, the country where the violation occurred will hold both the organization that issued the Carnet and the importer equally responsible. The importer is liable to his/her issuing association (and, in some cases, to the Customs authorities of the country where this transpired) for all duties and/or taxes and other sums which would normally be charged on the importation of such goods, as well as the amount charged as liquidated damages. If the US Customs Service finds that there was fraud involved in the importation, additional penalties may be assessed.

What happens when goods covered by a US-issued ATA Carnet are reimported into the US?

If goods covered by a US-issued Carnet are brought back into the United States within the validity period of the Carnet, the Carnet serves as the Customs control registration document and must be presented on re-importation. Whether the re-imported goods are subject to duty depends on exemption in the Harmonized Tariff Schedule [http : //www.usitc.gov/taffairs.htm](http://www.usitc.gov/taffairs.htm) and not on their status as Carnet goods. See 19 CFR 141.4 for goods that are exempted from entry documentation requirements and 19 CFR 141.2 for goods exempted from duty on re-importation.

What if the ATA Carnet has expired?

If the expiring ATA Carnet is a US-issued Carnet there will be no penalties or duties assessed by the United States, however, there may be penalties assessed by a foreign government if the Carnet expired before the US merchandise was exported from that country.

If the Carnet is foreign-issued then liquidated damages will be assessed by the US Customs Service due to the Carnet expiring before the merchandise could be exported out of the United States.

What is contained in an ATA Carnet document?

The Carnet document has a green cover page which provides the names of the Carnet holder and issuing association, the Carnet issue date, the Carnet number, the countries in which the Carnet may be used and a complete description of the goods covered. Two yellow sheets in the package are to be used upon exportation from and reimportation back into the issuing country. White sheets are used for the temporary importation into and reexportation from the second or additional countries. Blue sheets are used when transiting through countries.

Each sheet contains two parts – a counterfoil, which remains in the Carnet and describes the actions taken by Customs officers each time goods enter or leave a country, and a detachable voucher, which contains a list of the goods covered by the Carnet and serves as the required Customs document.

How is a US-issued ATA Carnet processed by Customs?

When leaving the United States, the holder of a US-issued ATA Carnet presents the Carnet and the covered goods to a Customs officer. The Carnet is reviewed for completeness and accuracy and the goods are examined to ensure that they match the Carnet list. The officer then validates the Carnet document and certifies the appropriate exportation counterfoil and voucher. The Carnet and the US Customs-certified export voucher are returned to the Carnet holder who retains the voucher as the permanent record of the Customs transaction. (Note : The Carnet does not affect export control requirements such as the filing of a shipper's export declaration or the requirement to obtain export licenses.) Upon return to the United States, the holder of a US-issued Carnet presents the Carnet and covered goods to a Customs officer for examination. The officer certifies the appropriate reimportation counterfoil and voucher and returns the Carnet to the holder for further use or surrender to the issuing association. (Note : On US-issued Carnets only, the vouchers of the yellow exportation/reimportation sheets will not be detached, but will remain with the document when departing or returning to the United States.)

It is the responsibility of the Carnet holder to present the Carnet to the Customs authorities when entering or leaving a country in order that the necessary verification and certification of the appropriate vouchers and counterfoils can take place. Failure to do so may result in a claim being made. A claim is a notice from a Customs authority of the country of import that a violation of the Carnet system has occurred and payment of duties, taxes, and penalty are required.

How is a non-US-issued ATA Carnet processed?

When processing a foreign-issued Carnet, Customs must create a record of the transaction in order to protect the revenue and domestic commerce. Therefore, the US Customs officer responsible for clearing the temporary importation must ensure that the port of importation, dates of Customs activities, and any departure from the original list of articles, are clearly shown in the appropriate fields.

When the merchandise leaves the US the Customs officer must ensure that the required exportation dates are complied with, that the original list of articles agrees with what is being exported, and that the appropriate voucher is detached and forwarded to the port of importation.

The trend of growth in exports of engineering goods and services over the last three years indicates a steady growth of above 20%. In exercise of powers conferred under Paragraph 2.4 of the Foreign Trade Policy 2004-2009, the Director General of Foreign Trade hereby makes the following amendments in the Handbook of Procedure (Vol. I) :

1. Paragraph 3.20.1 is amended to read as follows

A single consolidated application for all exports through EDI enabled ports shall be filed by the Head Office in case of Proprietorship and Partnership Firms and Registered Office/Corporate Office in case of Private Limited and Public Limited Companies to the concerned Regional Authority in the Aayaat Niryaat Form along with the documents prescribed therein for grant of duty credit under Focus Market Scheme. The application shall be filed on a six monthly basis, i.e. April – September and October – March where realization has been made during the period of application. Exports made on or after 01.04.2006 shall be eligible for the benefits. In case of Advance Payment, date of exports shall be taken into account for inclusion in the period of application.

The application for claiming duty credit under the scheme shall be submitted within a period of six months from the last date of the period of the application (i.e. for the period of application April'06 to September'06, the last date of application shall be 31st March, 2007).

2. Paragraph 3.20.3 is amended to read as follows

The applicant shall be required to submit a proof of landing of the export consignment in the specified market.

The duty credit entitlement certificate shall be granted on FOB value realized as per BRC/FIRC. In cases where the applicant applies for the credit entitlement certificate after realization or shipments are made against irrevocable letter of credit or bill of exchange is unconditionally Avalised/Co-Accepted/Guaranteed by a bank and the same is confirmed by the exporters bank and certified by the bank in the relevant Bank Certificate of Export and Realization, the credit entitlement certificate shall be issued with transferable endorsement.

3. Paragraph 3.20.4 is amended to read as follows

The duty credit entitlement certificate shall be issued with a single port of registration. The port of registration shall be one of the ports, from which the exports have been made. However, the applicant may use the duty credit scrip for imports through any other port (that includes ICD/LCS) after obtaining TRA from the port of registration.

Exim Bank's Line of Credit of USD 250 million to Ecowas Bank for Investment and Development (EBID)

The Export-Import Bank of India (Exim Bank) has extended a Line of Credit (LOC) to Ecowas Bank for Investment and Development (EBID) headquartered at Lome', Togo, for US\$ 250 Million (US Dollars two hundred fifty million only) under the Credit Agreement dated May 25, 2006 (as amended) for financing export of equipment, goods and services eligible for export under the Foreign Trade Policy of India, from India to member countries of EBID viz. Benin, Burkina Faso, Cape Verde, Cote d'Ivoire, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone and Togo.

2. The Credit Agreement has become effective on October 17, 2006. Accordingly, under the LOC, the utilization period will expire at the end of 48 months from the scheduled completion date(s) of contract(s), in the case of project contracts and on May 24, 2012 (72 months from date of execution of Credit Agreement) in case of supply contracts.

3. The above LOC facility is available only for public sector projects in the member countries of EBID. For each project, EBID would need to first forward the project proposal to Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, for consideration before final approval by Exim Bank.

4. Shipments under the credit will have to be declared on GR/SDF Forms as per instructions issued by Reserve Bank from time to time.

5. No agency commission is payable under the above line of credit. However, if required the exporter may use his own resources or utilize balances of his EEFC account for payment of commission in free foreign exchange. Authorised Dealer Category I (AD Category I) banks may allow such remittance after realisation of full payment of contract value subject to compliance of prevailing instructions on payment of agency commission.

6. AD Category I banks may bring the contents of this Circular to the notice of their exporter constituents and advise them to obtain full details of the Line of Credit from Exim Bank's office at Centre One Building, Floor 21, World Trade Centre Complex, Cuffe Parade, Mumbai - 400 005.

7. The directions contained in this Circular have been issued under Sections 10(4) and 11(1) of the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA), 1999 (42 of 1999) and is without prejudice to permissions/approvals, if any, required under any other law.
