*My dear fellow exporters,*

*The revised MDA Guideline has been announced and it comes into effect from April 01, 2006. A number of positive changes have been made in the new guideline, as a result of which more number of exporters will be in a position to avail of the scheme.*

*In view of the increased export volume of individual exporters, I was continuously in touch with the Ministry of Commerce for enhancing the limit of FOB value of exports so that existing exporters could continue to make use of the scheme as well as more exporters could be covered under the scheme. Consequently, in the revised guideline, the limit of FOB value has been enhanced from Rs. 10 crores to Rs. 15 crores. In addition, the maximum financial ceiling has been enhanced for both Focus as well as General areas. Further, the scheme of reimbursement of 75% to Non-SSI and 90% to SSI has been withdrawn. The guideline is already available in Council's website as well as in the website of the Ministry of Commerce and it is also published in the present issue.*

*I am confident that the revised guideline will definitely give a boost to explore new export markets and I believe that you will make the fullest advantage of the scheme.*

**Indo-Bulgarian Trade**

Total trade between India and Bulgaria for the month of January 2006 stood at BGN 6.5 million (\$ 4.01 million), with imports from India at BGN 4.3 million (\$ 2.65 million) and exports to India at BGN 2.2 million (\$ 1.36 million) as compared to total trade of BGN 7.7 million (\$ 4.75 million) in January 2005, with imports from India in the amount of BGN 6.3 million (\$ 3.88 million) and exports to India at BGN 1.4 million (\$ 864,198). Therefore, in January 2006, monthly trade balance of \$ 1.29 million was in India's favour while in January 2005 monthly trade balance was of \$ 3.02 million again in India's favour.

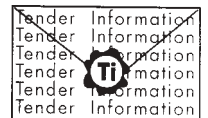
**The Netherlands**

**Amsterdam as a Business Location :** As per a two year study conducted by the firm KPMG, Amsterdam is a popular business location in Europe and only the city of Lyon in France is more popular. Business costs in Amsterdam are lower than in London, Paris and Frankfurt. Compared with virtually all large cities in the US and Asia, the Amsterdam region is also cheaper. While conducting the study, KPMG looked at the start-up costs for new company locations and costs of labour, energy, telecommunications and taxes over a period of 10 years.

**Car Sales :** As per the automotive sector organizations, RAI and BOVAG, a total of 159,919 cars were sold in the Netherlands during the first quarter of 2006. The share of compact and small cars rose to 30% from 25.9% during the same period of 2005. The market share of diesel cars rose from 26.5% in 2005 to 28.7% in the first quarter of this year.

**GSR 260 (E)** In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 25 of the Customs Act, 1962 (52 of 1962), the Central Government, being satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest so to do, hereby exempts materials imported into India against a **Duty Free Import Authorisation** issued in terms of paragraph 4.4.1 and 4.4.2 of the Foreign Trade Policy (hereinafter referred to as the said authorisation) from the **whole of the duty of Customs** leviable thereon which is specified in the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 (51 of 1975) and from **the whole of the additional duty, safeguard duty and anti-dumping duty** leviable thereon, respectively, under sections 3, 8 and 9A of the said Customs Tariff Act, subject to the following conditions namely :-

- (i) that the description, value and quantity of materials imported are covered by the said authorisation and the said authorisation is produced before the proper officer of Customs at the time of clearance for debit :

Provided that in respect of resultant product specified in paragraph 4.55.3 of the Hand Book of Procedures (Vol. I) of the Foreign Trade Policy, the materials permitted in the said authorisation or a duty free import authorisation for intermediate supply, as the case may be, shall be of the same quality, technical characteristics and specifications as the materials used in the said resultant product.

Provided further that in respect of the said resultant product the exporter shall give declaration with regard to the quality, technical characteristic and specifications of materials used in the shipping bill;

- (ii) that where import takes place after fulfilment of export obligation, the shipping bill number(s) and date(s) and quantity and Free on Board (FOB) value of the resultant product are endorsed on the said authorization :

Provided that where import takes place before fulfilment of export obligation, the quantity and FOB value of the resultant product to be exported are endorsed on the said authorization;

- (iii) that the importer at the time of clearance of the imported materials executes a bond with such surety or security and in such form and for such sum as may be specified by the Deputy Commissioner of Customs or Assistant Commissioner of Customs, as the case may be, binding himself to pay on demand an amount equal to the duty leviable, but for the exemption contained herein, on the imported materials in respect of which the conditions specified in this notification have not been complied with, together with interest at the rate of fifteen per cent per annum from the date of clearance of the said materials :

Provided that bond shall not be necessary in respect of imports made after the discharge of export obligation in full;

- (iv) that the imports and exports are undertaken through seaports at Mumbai, Kolkata, Cochin, Magdalla, Kakinada, Kandla, Mangalore, Marmagoa, Chennai, Nhava Sheva, Paradeep, Pipavav, Sikka, Tuticorin, Visakhapatnam, Dahej, Mundhra, Nagapattinam, Okha, Bedi (including Rozi-Jamnagar), Muldwarka, Porbander, Dharamatar and Vadinar or through any of the airports at Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Bhubaneswar, Mumbai, Kolkata, Coimbatore, Delhi, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Chennai, Srinagar, Trivandrum, Varanasi, Nagpur, Cochin, Rajasansi (Amritsar) and Lucknow (Amausi) or through any of the Inland Container Depots at Agra, Bangalore, Coimbatore, Delhi, Faridabad, Gauhati, Guntur, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Jalandhar, Kanpur, Ludhiana, Moradabad, Nagpur, Pimpri (Pune), Pitampur (Indore), Surat, Tirupur, Varanasi, Nasik, Rudrapur (Nainital), Dighi (Pune), Vadodara, Daulatabad (Wanjarwadi and Maliwada), Waluj (Aurangabad), Anaparthi (Andhra Pradesh), Salem, Malanpur, Singanalur, Jodhpur, Kota, Udaipur, Ahmedabad, Bhiwadi, Madurai, Bhilwara, Pondicherry, Garhi Harsaru, Bhatinda, Dappar (Dera Bassi), Chheharata (Amritsar), Karur, Miraj, Rewari, Bhusawal, Jamshedpur, Surajpur, Dadri, Tuticorin, Kundli, Bhadohi, Raipur, Mandideep, Durgapur and Babarpur or through the Land Customs Station at Ranaghat, Singhabad, Raxaul, Jogbani, Nautanva (Sonauli), Petrapole, Mahadipur, Nepalganj Road, Dawki, Agartala, Sutarkhandi, Amritsar Rail Cargo and Attari Road or Special Economic Zone as specified in the Notification issued under section 76A of the Customs Act, 1962 (52 of 1962).

Provided that the Commissioner of Customs may, by special order or by a Public Notice and subject to such conditions

as may be specified by him, permit import and export from any other seaport/airport/inland container depot or through any land customs station;

- (v) that the export obligation as specified in the said authorisation (both in value and quantity terms) is discharged within the period specified in the said authorisation or within such extended period as may be granted by the Regional Authority by exporting resultant products, manufactured in India which are specified in the said authorisation and in respect of which facility under rule 18 (rebate of duty paid on materials used in the manufacture of resultant product) or sub-rule 2 of rule 19 of the Central Excise Rules, 2002 or CENVAT credit under CENVAT credit rules, 2004 in respect of materials imported/procured against the said authorisation has not been availed :

Provided that an Advance Intermediate authorisation holder shall discharge export obligation by supplying the resultant products to the exporter in terms of paragraph 4.1.3 (ii) of the Policy;

- (vi) that the importer produces evidence of discharge of export obligation to the satisfaction of the Deputy Commissioner of Customs or Assistant Commissioner of Customs, as the case may be, within a period of thirty days of the expiry of period allowed for fulfilment of export obligation, or within such extended period as the said Deputy Commissioner of Customs or Assistant Commissioner of Customs, as the case may be, may allow;
- (vii) that exempt materials shall not be disposed of or utilised in any manner, except for utilisation in discharge of export obligation, before the export obligation under the said authorisation has been discharged in full;
- (viii) that where the Bond filed under condition (iii) against the said authorisation has not been redeemed by the Deputy Commissioner of Customs or Assistant Commissioner of Customs, as the case may be, the unutilised material may be transferred to any other manufacturer for processing under actual user condition after complying the Central Excise procedure relating to job work;
- (ix) that in relation to the said authorisation issued to a merchant exporter,-
- (a) the name and address of the supporting manufacturer is specified in the said authorisation and the bond required to be executed by the importer in terms of condition (iii) shall be executed jointly by the merchant exporter and the supporting manufacturer binding themselves jointly and severally to comply with the conditions specified in this Notification; and

- (b) exempt materials are utilised in the factory of such supporting manufacturer for discharge of export obligation and the same shall not be transferred or sold or used for any other purpose by the said merchant exporter until the export obligation specified in condition (v) has been discharged in full.

2. After discharge of export obligation as specified in condition (v) of paragraph 1, the Regional Authority shall permit transfer of the said authorisation and/or the goods imported under it subject to such conditions as may be specified.

3. Where the materials are found defective or unfit for use, the said materials may be re-exported back to the foreign supplier within three years from the date of payment of duty on the importation thereof :

Provided that at the time of re-export the materials are identified to the satisfaction of the Deputy Commissioner of Customs or Assistant Commissioner of Customs, as the case may be, as the materials which were imported.

Explanation - For the purposes of this Notification,-

- (i) "Foreign Trade Policy" means the Foreign Trade Policy 2004-2009 published vide Notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, No. 1/2006 dated the 7th April, 2006;
- (ii) "Regional Authority" means the Director General of Foreign Trade appointed under section 6 of the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act, 1992 (22 of 1992) or an officer authorized by him to grant an authorization under the said Act;
- (iii) "Materials" means -
- (a) raw materials, components, intermediates, consumables, catalysts, and parts which are required for manufacture of resultant product;
- (b) mandatory spares within a value limit of ten per cent of the value of the authorisation which are required to be exported alongwith the resultant product;
- (c) fuel required for manufacture of resultant product; and
- (d) packaging materials required for packing of resultant product.
- (iv) "manufacture" has the same meaning as is assigned to it in paragraph 9.37 of the Foreign Trade Policy.

**Export Warehousing - extension of facility in the Taluka Ankleshwar in the district of Bharuch in the state of Gujarat - reg.**

I am directed to refer to Board's Circular No. 581/18/2001-CX dated 29th June, 2001 which interalia, specifies conditions, procedures, class of exporters and places under sub-rule (2) of rule 20 of Central Excise Rules, 2002 for warehousing of excisable goods for the purpose of export. In paragraph 2(2) of the said Circular, the Board has specified places where warehouses may be established. Now, representations have been received from the trade as well as field formations to include the taluka Ankleshwar in the district of Bharuch in the state of Gujarat in the list of places mentioned in the said Circular.

2. The matter has been examined. Board is of the view that extension of the facility of export warehousing to the taluka Ankleshwar in the District of Bharuch in the state of Gujarat would facilitate the trade and industry. Accordingly, it is decided to amend paragraph 2(2) of the said Circular dated 29.6.2001 to include the taluka Ankleshwar in the district of Bharuch in the state of Gujarat. The said paragraph shall now read as follows :

“(2) Places : The warehouses may be established and registered in Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Kolkata, Chennai, Delhi, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Ludhiana, Mumbai, the districts of Pune and Raigad in the state of Maharashtra, the district of East Midnapore in the state of West Bengal, the district of Indore in the state of Madhya Pradesh and the taluka Ankleshwar in the district of Bharuch in the state of Gujarat.”

**A. P. (DIR Series) Circular No. 31**

Dated 21st April, 2006

**Export of Goods and Services - Extension of  
period of realization**

Attention of Authorised Dealer (AD) banks is invited to AP(DIR Series) Circular No. 20 dated January 28, 2002, in terms of which AD banks have been permitted to grant extension of time for realization of export proceeds beyond the prescribed period from the date of export, where invoice value does not exceed US\$ 100,000 subject to the conditions prescribed therein.

2. As a measure of further liberalization, it has now been decided to increase the invoice value limit to US\$ 1 million from **existing** US\$ 100,000 with immediate effect. Accordingly, AD banks may henceforth grant extension of time for realization of export proceeds beyond prescribed period from the date of export up to the invoice value of US\$ 1 million subject to **existing** terms and conditions.

3. AD banks may bring the contents of this Circular to the notice of their constituents concerned.

4. The directions contained in the Circular have been issued under Section 10(4) and Section 11(1) of Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 (42 of 1999) and without prejudice to permissions/approvals, if any, required under any other law.

**Exim Bank's Line of Credit of US\$ 50.40 Million to the Fiji  
Sugar Corporation Ltd., Fiji Islands**

The Export-Import Bank of India (Exim Bank) has concluded an agreement with the Fiji Sugar Corporation Ltd., Fiji Islands making available to the latter a Line of Credit (LOC) upto an aggregate sum of USD 50.40 Million (US Dollar Fifty Million Four Hundred Thousand only). The credit agreement has become effective on January 12, 2006. The credit is available for financing exports from India of equipment, goods and services which are eligible for export under the Foreign Trade Policy of the Government of India, for modernization, upgradation and capacity expansion of Sugar Plants of the Fiji Sugar Corporation Limited, in the Fiji Islands. Full details of the Line of Credit are available at the Exim Bank's office or its website ([www.eximbankindia.com](http://www.eximbankindia.com)).

2. The terminal utilization period is 48 months from scheduled completion date of contract in case of project exports and 72 months from the date of execution of the Credit Agreement in case of other supply contracts.

3. Shipments under the credit will have to be declared on GR/SDF Forms as per instructions issued from time to time.

4. No agency commission is payable under the above line of credit. However, if required the exporter may use his own resources or utilize balances of his EEFC account for payment of commission in free foreign exchange. Authorised Dealer banks may allow such remittance after realisation of full payment of contract value subject to compliance of prevailing instructions on payment of agency commission.

5. Authorised Dealer banks may bring the contents of this Circular to the notice of their exporter constituents.

6. The directions contained in this Circular have been issued under Section 10(4) and 11(1) of the Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 (42 of 1999) and is without prejudice to permissions/approvals, if any, required under any other law.

**MARKETING DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE SCHEME  
(REVISED GUIDELINES W.E.F. 01.04.2006)**

Export promotion continues to be a major thrust area for the Government. In view of the prevailing macro economic situation with emphasis on exports and to facilitate various measures being undertaken to stimulate and diversify the country's export trade, Marketing Development Assistance (MDA) Scheme is under operation through the Department of Commerce to support the under mentioned activities :

- (i) Assist exporters for export promotion activities abroad.
- (ii) Assist Export Promotion Councils (EPCs) to undertake export promotion activities for their product(s) and commodities
- (iii) Assist approved organizations/trade bodies in undertaking exclusive non-recurring innovative activities connected with export promotion efforts for their members.
- (iv) Assist Focus export promotion programmes in specific regions abroad like FOCUS (LAC), Focus (Africa), Focus (CIS) and Focus (ASEAN + 2) programmes.
- (v) Residual essential activities connected with marketing promotion efforts abroad.

Assistance to individual exporters for export promotion activities abroad – Participation in EPC etc. led Trade Delegations/BSMs/Trade Fairs/Exhibitions :

- (i) Exporting companies with an f.o.b. value of exports of up to **Rs. 15 crore** in the preceding year will be eligible for MDA assistance for participation in trade delegations/BSMs/fairs/exhibitions abroad to explore new markets for export of their specific product(s) and commodities from India in the initial phase. This will be subject to the condition that the exporter is having complete 12 months membership with concerned EPC etc. and filing of returns with concerned EPC/organisation regularly. **However, this condition would not apply in case of a new EPC for a period of 5 years from the date of its creation.**
- (ii) Assistance would be permissible on travel expenses by air, in Economy Excursion Class fair and/or charges of the built up furnished stall. This would, however, be subject to an upper ceiling mentioned in the table per tour.

The participation of individual companies in the above activities shall be subject to the following conditions :

- (1) For EPC etc. led Trade Delegations/BSMs only air-fare by Economy Excursion Class up to a maximum of **Rs. 70,000 (Rs. 1,00,000 in case of Focus LAC)** shall be permissible. For participation in Trade Fairs/Exhibitions reimbursement shall be permissible subject to ceilings mentioned in the column 4 in the above table.



- (2) Maximum number of permissible participations shall be five in a financial year as indicated in above table (No travel grant is permissible for visit to General Areas).

However, for priority sectors, having large employment generation potential, viz. Agriculture including food items, Handicrafts, Handlooms, Carpets, Leather & Minor Forest Produce including LAC, 2 (two) participations in General Areas would be admissible with the assistance of Rs. 1,50,000 for each participation. The exporters availing of assistance under this provision would, however, be in addition to these participations, eligible for only any 2 Focus Area participations.

- (3) Assistance shall be permissible to one regular employee/director/partner/proprietor of the company. Assistance would not be available to exporter of foreign nationality or holding foreign passport.
- (4) Intimation application must be received in the concerned EPC etc. with a minimum of 14 days clear advance notice excluding the date of receipt of application in the office of the concerned organization and the date of departure from the country.
- (5) The company shall not be under investigation/charged/prosecuted/debarred/black listed under the Foreign Trade Policy of India or any other law relating to export and import business.
- (6) **Member-exporters of EPCs etc. would also be eligible for MDA assistance for participation in events organized by ITPO abroad. Their applications/claims would be routed/reimbursed through concerned EPC etc.**
- (7) Maximum MDA assistance shall be inclusive of MDA assistance received from all Govt. bodies/FIEO/EPCs/Commodity Boards/Export Development Authorities/ITPO etc.
- (8) A Maximum of three participations in a particular trade fair/exhibition would be eligible for MDA assistance and exporting companies after availing assistance three times including past cases for a particular fair/exhibition, have to participate in that fair, if any, on self-financing basis.

### DOCUMENTATION FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF ASSISTANCE TO EXPORTERS

- (i) Intimation application in *Annexure I* duly completed and signed shall be submitted by the exporter to the concerned EPC etc. giving clear 14 days advance notice. Intimation and the application must be sent electronically by E-mail also.
- (ii) **Concerned Organization (FIEO, EPC etc.) on receipt of intimation shall immediately issue acknowledge receipt.** Thereafter they will examine and issue approval letter to the exporter preferable within 5 working days of the receipt of the intimation, in the prescribed format (*Annexure-II*).
- (iii) Claim along with the declaration duly completed **and the Certificate [as per Annexure IV] duly signed by a Chartered Accountant** shall be submitted by the exporter to the concerned Organization (FIEO), EPC etc.] in the prescribed format (*Annexure-III*) along with under mentioned papers immediately on return to India after completion of the activity but positively within 45 days of their return to India :
- Details of activity undertaken earlier with MDA assistance to the same country/countries.
  - Legible photocopy of passport highlighting the entries about departure from and arrival into India and also the countries visited. In case, passport does not have arrival/departure dates regarding visits to various countries, some documentary evidence such as Hotel Bills, Boarding Pass, Lodging Pass etc. be submitted.
  - Original air ticket/jacket used during the journey. If original air ticket/jacket is lost, a legible photocopy of the same along with a certificate from the concerned airline indicating following may be sent :
    - (a) Name of the Traveller
    - (b) Ticket Number
    - (c) Flight No.
    - (d) Date of Departure from India
    - (e) Sectors/Countries Visited
    - (f) Class in which travelled
    - (g) Economy Excursion Class Fare for Sectors/Countries Visited
  - Self certified f.o.b. value export figures during the last three financial years, year wise.
  - Brief report about the activity participated and achievements made.



(iv) Claim forms duly filled in and complete in all respects must be submitted to the concerned EPC, FIEO etc., within 90 days of return to India. However, claims submitted within 30 days from the expiry of the 90 days period may be entertained by or wherein the deficiencies in the claim as intimated by the concerned EPC, FIEO etc., with 10% deduction. The claims which are submitted after 120 days of return to India shall not be entertained under any circumstances. Any deficiencies in the claim as intimated by the concerned EPC, FIEO etc., must be completed within 30 days of the date of directions given in this regard failing which the claim shall stand rejected without any further intimation or reminder in this regard by the concerned EPC, FIEO etc.
