## Gujarat: 4 workers killed, 20 hurt in Surat chemical factory fire

SURAT, SEPT 11 /-- Four workers were killed and 20 others injured after a fire broke out in a chemical factory in Gujarat's Surat city, officials said on Sunday.

The blaze erupted around 10.30 am on Sunday due to a blast in a chemical container and spread fast to other parts of the unit of Anupam Rasayan India Limited, located in Sachin Gujarat Industrial Development Corporation (GIDC) area, Surat in-charge Chief Fire

Officer Basant Pareek said. Officials of the Sachin GIDC police station earlier in the day said a worker was killed and three others were missing. They later found four bodies in the incident. A fourth body was found in the factory night, while the bodies of three other missing workers were found in the factory premises on Sunday," police inspector D V Baldaniya said.

As many as 20 workers were injured and undergoing treatment at various hospitals in Surat, he said. After the fire was reported on Saturday night, 15 fire tenders were rushed to the site. The blaze was controlled after hectic efforts for about two hours, Pareek said. The Anupam Rasayan company in a statement said, "The unfortunate fire incident" occurred at one of the manufacturing blocks of the factory. "The cause for the incident is being investigated by our special team," it said, adding that the 20 injured people are

undergoing treatment at local hospital. "Our priority is currently our workers and employees. As a responsible corporate, we stand committed to supporting our affected employees," the company said. "We are trying to assess the damage and will take appropriate actions to operationalise the plant shortly. Also, we are covered for the loss of assets and loss of profits under insurance," it added. ## Khap mahapanchayat seeks CBI probe into Phogat's death case

HISAR, SEPT 11 /-- The Sarv Jatiya Khap Mahapanchayat on Sunday gave an ultimatum to the BJP government to recommend a CBI probe into leader Sonali Phogat's death case.

The mahapanchayat was held at Jai Dharmshala of Hisar. Sonali Phogat, daughter of Yashodhara and other family members also took part in the council. Phogat, 43, whose death is being treated as a case of murder, had died some hours after her arrival in Goa in late August.

The mahapanchayat has decided to call another such council on September 24 if the government fails to order an enquiry by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) into the matter. Khap representatives from over Haryana and other states would participate and take a "tough decision" on September 24, it held. A 15-member committee was formed in the mahapanchayat. It also includes five members of Sonali's family. Making an appeal, Yashodhara said, "Support me to get justice for my mother."

Yashodhara with folded hands demanded a CBI

inquiry. People raised their hands and promised to support her. The Goa Police has been conducting investigations into Phogat's death case.

They had also conducted investigations in Haryana, including Hisar, Rohtak and Gurugram. Phogat's family members had been striking to their demand of an CBI probe into her death, saying they were dissatisfied with the Goa police probe.

Some family members of Phogat had earlier also said they will file a petition before a court seeking a CBI probe in the case in case the Goa government does not recommend an investigation by the premier investigating agency.

Phogat and her aides had paraded at the Curries restaurant in Goa on the eve of the midnight of August 22 and 23.

Phogat, a former Tark star and contestant on the reality TV show 'Bigg Boss', was brought dead to a hospital in North Goa district on August 23, a day after arriving in the coastal state.

So far, accused Sudhir Sangwan, another aide Sukhwinder Singh, and three others have been

arrested by the Goa Police in connection with the murder. Earlier in the day, Sonali's brother Rinku Dhabka said if the government had decided to recommend a CBI inquiry, then there would not have been any need to hold the Khap Mahapanchayat (PTI).

## Forest personnel dying in duty to get higher solatium of Rs 50 lakh: Karnataka CM

BENGALURU, SEPT 11 /-- The Karnataka government will hike the solatium from the existing Rs 30 lakh to Rs 50 lakh, aimed at ensuring stability and social security to the families of forest officials who died in the line of duty, chief minister Basavaraj Bommai said on Sunday.

Speaking after paying respects to the persons who lost their lives in the forest, as part of National Forest Martyrs Day-2022 organised by the Forest Department here, he said the state's forest cover must be increased from the current 21 per cent to 30 per cent. Pointing out that his predecessor, B S Yeddyurappa had hiked the solatium paid to the fallen officials' families from Rs 20 lakh to Rs 30 lakh, Bommai

said the incumbent government will further hike it from Rs 30 lakh to Rs 50 lakh.

Besides, the government will ensure appointment of the family members to jobs on compassionate grounds and will take care of their welfare with utmost sympathy.

"You protect the forest,
