## 56th Report



The Working Committee of EEPC INDIA has the pleasure in presenting its report on the activities of the Council for the year ended 31st March, 2011.

#### EXPORT PERFORMANCE

#### A. Export Performance

#### Overall Exports up by 37.50%

In the reporting year, India's cumulative value of merchandise exports was US\$ 245868.29 million (Rs. 1118822.85 crore) as against US\$ 178751.41 million (Rs. 845533.62 crore) registering a growth of 37.50% in Dollar terms and 32.30% in Rupee terms as compared to the previous fiscal for 2010-11. [based on the provisional data released by DGCI&S]

## B. Performance of Engineering Sector in the FY 2010-11

Based on the provisional data published by DGCI&S for the period April 2010 to March 2011, India's export of engineering goods have posted a growth of 84.17% in USD terms in comparison to the previous fiscal. The provisional data indicates that exports of engineering goods from India have reached US\$ 60006.28 million during 2010-11.

In Rupee terms, based on the same provisional data given by DGCI&S, India's export of engineering goods are valued at Rs. 272957.84 crore during 2010-11 which is 76.73% higher than Rs. 154451,79 crore during 2009-10.

#### C. Performance: Principal Commodity-wise

Exports of the Principal Commodities like Machinery & Instruments, Machine Tools, Iron & Steel Bar/Rods, Residual Engineering Items, Manufactures of Metals, Ferro Alloys, Non-Ferrous Metals, Aluminium other than products, Primary & Semi-finished Iron & Steel, Transport Equipment, Mica have all shown growth in 2010-11.

#### PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES

During the year under review, EEPC India organized various activities both in India and abroad for promoting exports of engineering goods and services. Besides organizing it's own events, EEPC India organized Indian participation in various exhibitions by setting up Information Booths and Catalogue Shows with the assistance of its foreign offices and Indian Embassies abroad. During the year, EEPC India organized two INDEEs - in Bogota (Colombia) and Cairo (Egypt). Also, as part of the initiative of the Union Commerce & Industry Minister, Shri Anand Sharma to promote Brand India through "MADE IN INDIA" shows across the world, Embassy of India organized an India Show in Istanbul, Turkey with the support of the Ministry of Commerce & Industry. The main objective of "The India Show" is to promote India's image and provide a platform to Indian Exporters to showcase their strengths and capabilities in an emerging market and developing country. Also, the Council arranged Buyer Seller Meets and Delegations in India and abroad for the benefit of exporters. The overseas offices were instrumental for product mailing campaign and updating of importers/distributors list of their respective territories covered by each office.

In the domestic arena, the Council conducted various seminars, workshops and awareness seminars on export finance, quality upgradation, focus country programmes, award functions and meetings with government agencies for solving the exporter's problems. Information on overseas trade opportunities for products, turnkey projects and services were regularly collected and disseminated among member-exporters.

#### A. OVERSEAS

#### **Exhibitions Organized**

#### 1. Trade Fairs and Exhibitions -Participated/Organized

EEPC India's major promotional activities include organizing and participating in specialized exhibitions in the overseas segment. EEPC India organized on its own, product displays of its member firms in INDEE (Indian Engineering Exhibition), mobilized India's engineering industry's participation in Specialized Fairs and also set up Information Booths in some of the international trade fairs. Product catalogues/profiles of Indian engineering companies demonstrating the competence and capabilities levels in various fields in engineering sector and EEPC India's own charts/publications were put on display in the Information Booths. EEPC India's repre-sentatives utilized the events for establishing and firming up contacts with as many visiting buyers as possible with the sole objective to make them aware of Indian

engineering industries' capabilities and help generating their interest in Indian products. EEPC India organized India's engineering industries' participation and set up Information Booths at the following exhibitions in 2010-11:

#### INDEE Bogota 2010, Colombia

EEPC INDIA organized its 23rd Indian Engineering Exhibition (INDEE) for 5 days from 4-8 October 2010 at Corferias Bogota, Centro Internacional de Negocios y Exposiciones de Bogota, Colombia. This exhibition coincided with Feria Internacional de Bogota, organized by Corferias Bogota – Internacional Business and Exhibition Center. This exhibition was a tailor made product to enhance India's exports to Colombia and for penetrating into the entire Latin American region.

151 Indian companies took part in this exhibition, representing the product sectors such as Metalworking – Machine tools & accessories including cutting tools, Automotive industry – Auto parts & accessories including trucks & trailers, Casting & forging, Steel pipes & tubes, Steel, Steel mill machinery, Fabricated steel structure, Steel flanges & fittings, Electrical & Energy and allied services, Equipments, Pumps, compressors & valves, Fasteners, Power tools & hand tools, Machinery for the food processing, Machinery for the agribusiness, Mining machinery & components, Textile machinery, Plastic & Packaging machinery, Wood industry machinery, Industrial machinery, Builders' hardware, SS utensils etc.

#### INDEE Cairo 2010, Egypt

The 24th Indian Engineering Exhibition (INDEE) was organized in Cairo, Egypt from 25th to 28th November 2010. The event took place in conjunction with MACTECH – a premier exhibition of machine tools, industrial tools and welding and cutting equipment - at the Cairo International

Convention Centre. INDEE Cairo was EEPC India's third major exhibition in Egypt after the success of the first in the year 2000 and the second in the year 2006.

79 Indian companies took part in this exhibition, representing the product sectors such as motor vehicle parts, optical equipment, fabricated metal products, bicycles and parts, steam generators, metalworking and metal forming machines, machines for wire and tube forming, welding and cutting equipment, grinding and polishing machines, horizontal and vertical lathes, drilling and boring machines and consumables, honing and lapping machines, hand tools, power tools, precision tools, pneumatic and hydropneumatic tools, die casting machines, forging machines, moulds and dies, robotic process and automation, laser equipment, measuring and testing equipment, woodworking machines and tools, air and gas compressors, vacuum pumps, air treatment and air control systems, motors, heads, starters, material handling and transportation equipment, storage equipment and containers and packaging equipment.

### The India Show, Istanbul, Turkey during 3-6 February, 2011

As a part of the Government Policy, to promote "BRAND INDIA" concept by organizing at least six "MADE IN INDIA" shows in a year, as announced by the Hon'ble Union Commerce & Industry Minister, Shri Anand Sharma in the Foreign Trade Policy for the year 2009-14, EEPC India organized its maiden "The India Show" in Istanbul, Turkey from 3rd to 6th February 2011. The event took place in conjunction with WIN Part 1 – a premier exhibition of metal working, welding, surface treatment and material handling – at the Tüyap Fair Convention and Congress Center, Istanbul, Turkey. The main objective of the India Show was to promote India's image and provide a platform to Indian exporters to showcase their strengths and capabilities in an emerging market and fast developing economy like Turkey.

The Show also enabled India to get closer to rapidly growing markets like in Eurasia and Middle East. Another major objective was to highlight India as the 'Technology Hub' for the manufacturing industry as well as the Small, Medium and Large enterprises.

#### TID Head Office

#### Mailing Campaigns

Government Circulars, Notifications, Public Notices, Invitation mailer for INDEE, THE INDIA SHOW etc. were disseminated by mail to all members of the Council on regular basis. Also, undertook mailing campaigns for Council's various promotional activities held during the year.

#### ♦ Video Conferencing

Video conferencing facilities in the Council's offices in Kolkata, Mumbai, Chennai and New Delhi were implemented. A live session on Union Budget 2011 was organized on 28th February, 2011 where the Chairman of the Council along with WC members, RC members from different regions and Tax Consultants/experts had participated and discussed the pros and cons of the Budget amongst themselves. Various Panel and other Committees' meetings were organized on a regular basis through this facility.

#### \* Bulk Mailing

The department had circulated a large number of mails such as Government Circulars, Notifications, Information received from Indian Missions abroad as well as problems faced by the members on a regular basis to its members through Bulk mailing service. Council also sent Engineering Export Info-Bulletin, an online weekly Newsletter on a regular basis to inform its members about the recent activities.

#### **♦** Country Profiles/Market Survey Reports

Country Profiles/Market Survey Reports on the countries viz; Netherlands, Singapore, Serbia, Indonesia, Slovakia, Ethiopia, Canada, Colombia, Brazil, Panama, Ecuador, Peru, Austria, Turkey etc. have been prepared on account of the promotional events organized by the Council during the year. The same have been published in Weekly Newsletter (EEIB) and hosted in our website.

#### ♦ Trade Enquiries

Trade enquiries received through Council's Foreign Offices, Indian Embassies/Missions abroad, direct from the party had been provided to all members of the Council from time to time. In this regard, this division developed a format for verification purpose before publishing/disseminating the same to the members.

#### ♦ Knowledge Partner/Event Partner

The department identified and made liaison with various service providers and agencies which were helpful for the manufacturers and exporters. Such service providers/agencies were invited as Knowledge Partner/Event Partner for various activities undertaken by the Council.

#### ♦ Marketing of Council's Information Portal

Members are kindly aware that the Council having its own Website. A good number of firms have already registered their names in the Council's Website, which is exclusively for the Engineering sector. The Council being a Government sponsored organization adds confidence to overseas buyers and the firms Hyperlinked their Website through EEPC India portal had benefited enormously.



#### Database of Foreign Buyers/Distributors/Importers

Databases of foreign buyers, distributors, importers of various countries relating to Council's promotional events as well as members requirement were prepared and provided for mailing campaigns.

#### ACTIVITIES OF PANELS AND COMMITTEES

During the reporting year, Commodity Panels, Territorial and other Committees, comprising member-exporters and representatives from service organizations, ably assisted the Council on various trade related aspects. These Panels and Committees met regularly, identified constraints faced by exporters, suggested suitable remedial measures and resolved local issues. The details of the Panel meetings held during the year are furnished in **Annexure V**.

#### POLICY MATTERS

The Annual Supplement 2010-11 to the Foreign Trade Policy 2009-14 was announced by the Hon'ble Union Minister of Commerce & Industry, Shri Anand Sharma on August 23, 2010 in New Delhi. The Government has set a total export target of US\$ 200 billion for the current fiscal. With a view to achieving this export target, the Government announced a large number of fiscal benefits.

The highlights of the Annual Supplement 2010-11 to the Foreign Trade Policy 2009-14 are as follows:

#### Higher Support for Market and Product Diversification

 Additional benefit of 2% bonus, over and above the existing benefits of 2% under Focus Product Scheme, allowed for the Engineering Items: Bicycle Parts and Grinding Media Balls (all of which were earlier eligible for 2% benefit).

#### Support for Technological up-gradation

 Zero duty EPCG scheme, introduced in August 2009 and valid for only two years upto 31.3.2011, has been extended by one more year till 31.3.2012. In addition, to give a boost to technological up-gradation for additional sectors as well, the benefit of the scheme has been expanded to additional engineering products.

#### Benefit and Flexibility to Status Holders

3. Status Holders contribute to a substantial part of our

exports. To support them to upgrade their technology, 1% Status Holder Incentive Scheme (SHIS) introduced in August 2009 and valid for only two years upto 31.3.2011, has been extended by one more year for 2011-12 exports. In addition, to give a boost to technological up-gradation for additional sectors as well, the benefit of the scheme has been expanded to cover additional engineering products.

#### Stability/Continuity of the Foreign Trade Policy

- The popular and exporter friendly Duty Entitlement Passbook (DEPB) scheme has been extended beyond 31.12.2010 till 30.06.2011.
- Availability of concessional Export Credit: Interest subvention of 2% for Rupee Export credit for sectors namely, Handloom, Handicraft, Carpet and SMEs for all export sectors, have been allowed till 31.3.2011 in the budget 2010-11. This facility has now been extended to a number of additional products pertaining to sectors like Engineering, leather, textiles, Jute.
- Advance Authorization for Annual Requirement shall also be exempted from payment of antidumping & Safeguard duty in line with the underlying principle that goods and services should be exported and not the taxes and levies.

#### Procedural Simplification and Reduction of Transaction Cost

- Exporters shall now have the flexibility to get a high value EPCG authorization by filing their EPCG application on Annual basis, without the need to file the application for individual capital goods from time to time. It will reduce transaction time and cost.
- Exporters shall now have the flexibility to Club Advance authorization with Advance Authorization for Annual Requirement for the purpose of account closure.
- To impart flexibility to exporters and to facilitate smooth clearance of consignments, a Single customs notification for the two variants of Advance Authorization scheme namely advance authorization for physical exports & deemed exports shall be issued. It will also eliminate the ambiguity in clubbing of such exports.



- Ad-hoc Norms ratified under Advance Authorization scheme shall henceforth apply to all cases for the same export product upto one year not only prospectively but also retrospectively.
- Clarification on the availability of 4% SAD refund benefit, as given by DOR in terms of customs Notification No. 102/2007, only to trader importers, to be also extended to manufacturers, who sell the imported items like traders.
- Chartered Engineer Certificate for Advance Authorization on self declared basis, has been dispensed with. This will reduce documentation and the transaction cost.

#### **EDI Initiatives**

- 13. To reduce the transaction cost and time, the scope and domain of EDI is endeavoured to be continuously broadened. To remove redundancy of repeated submissions of RCMC, an 'e-RCMC' initiative has been commenced. Under this, the Export Promotion Councils would upload the RCMC data of their members on DGFT's website only once, thus reducing the procedural burden of repeated submissions and associated cost and time.
- 14. Facility of a data preparation module for Advance Authorization and Export Promotion Capital Good (EPCG) has been provided on an offline mode, which would reduce the need of continuous online interaction for long and address the connectivity and server response issues significantly.
- 15. In order to provide wider choice to the users and enlarge access for online filing, additional licenced certifying authorities for digital signatures and banks for electronic fund transfer (EFT) operations have been included in the gamut of EDI operations.
- The online message exchange for Annual Advance Authorization and Duty Free Import Authorization (DFIA) shall also be made operational with Customs w.e.f. 1.12.2010.

#### **Engineering and Electronics**

 Additional 2% bonus benefits over and above the existing benefits under Focus Product Scheme will significantly benefit Bicycle Parts and Grinding Media Balls exporters.

- 18. Additional items of Engineering, namely, Pipes & Tubes, Electric Generating Sets, Cast Articles of Iron & Steel, Ferro Manganese and Ferro Silicon shall now be entitled for benefit @ 2% under FPS.
- 19. A number of engineering items namely, Machine Tools, Compressors, Iron & Steel Structures including Transmission Towers and Scaffolding, LPG Cylinders, Ductile Tubes & Pipes shall now be entitled for benefits @ 2% of FOB value of exports to all markets under FPS instead of their exports to specific markets under MLFPS earlier.

#### Release of India-China Study

EEPC India had commissioned IIFT, New Delhi, to carry out a comparative study between Chinese Engineering Industry and the Indian Engineering Industry. We had requested IIFT to look at the various issues relating to prices of raw materials, export incentives to engineering industry as well as the WTO related issues in China and compare the same with the India's engineering industry.

The above study was released by Dr. Rahul Khullar. Secretary, Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India, on 16th November 2010 in New Delhi.

#### Preparation of Strategy Paper for the growth of Engineering Exports: 2010-2014

As per the decision of the Working Committee held in Kolkata on 26th March 2009 for preparation of the Long Term Strategy Paper on the growth of engineering exports for 2010-11 to 2014-15 so that the Council could plan appropriate strategies during the five years., the EEPC India had commissioned Ernst & Young to carry out the above Strategy Paper. The above study was completed and Ernst & Young had submitted the report to us. The Strategy paper was released by the Hon'ble Minister for Commerce & Industry, Shri Anand Sharma on Tuesday the 27th April 2010 at 13.00 hours in Udyog Bhawan, New Delhi.

#### Preparation of Strategy Paper for the growth of Auto and Auto Components : 2010-2014 "Driving into the Future"

EEPC India had commissioned the well-known international consultant Ernst & Young to carry out as Strategy Paper for the Growth of Auto and Auto



Components Exports for the period 2010-2014 so that the council could plan appropriate strategies during the above five years.

The above study was completed and Ernst & Young had submitted the report to us. This Strategy Paper was released by the Hon'ble Commerce Secretary, Government of India, Dr. Rahul Khullar on Wednesday, the 28th April 2010 at 15.00 hours in Udyog Bhawan, New Delhi.

#### Interest Subvention on Rupee Export Credit for Engineering Sector

The Council had taken up the issue with the various Departments for Interest Subvention on Rupee Export Credit for engineering sector. The Reserve Bank of India had issued a Circular No. DBOD. Dir (Exp). BC.No. 35/04.02. 001/2010-11 dated 9th August 2010 wherein the interest subvention has also been provided for the engineering sector effective 1st April 2010 to 31st March 2011.

#### Problem for Realization of Export Proceeds from Iran

We had made several representations to the various Departments in the Ministry including the RBI as some of the Public Sector Banks including SBI with regard to issues pertaining to export financing. However, the said member exporter intimates that all the Banks including SBI have advised that they are not in a position to process any financial transaction with Iran. They also state that they are given to understand that all Banks have been asked not to originate/process transaction related to Iran.

#### MARKET DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE (MDA)

The Council received MDA grant of Rs 4.75 crores from Ministry of Commerce & Industry during 2010-11 for disbursing among the individual exporters. Around 266 members were benefited under this scheme by participating in the Council's promotional events like INDEE, India Pavilion, BSM.

# A. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICY

- Expenses/Income, especially those relating to specific projects are accounted for in the year for which budget
  approval has been granted and not necessarily in the year of incurrence of expenditure. Any payment/receipt
  on that account is kept under advances/liabilities till the year of budget approval.
- Expenditure related to various Code and other specific activities are booked under those functional heads to conform to the budgets approved by the Government of India. As such, expenses shown under various natural heads are not necessarily the total expenditure incurred under these particular heads.
- The subscription income from members is not taken into account unless received. As such, no accrued income is considered in the accounts. Subscriptions received in advance have been treated as liability.
- Items of printing and stationery are charged to Income & Expenditure Account of the year in which the same are purchased.
- Pursuant to the policy adopted by the management in 1982-83, the expenditure on Publication is directly charged to Income & Expenditure account and no stock of publications at the end of the year is accounted for, as these are considered purely export promotional literature.
- Depreciation is being provided under the W.D.V. method at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956.
- 7. Foreign Currency Transaction:
  - (a) Income & Expenditure (including additions to and sale of Fixed Assets) in foreign currency are translated at standard rates fixed for the year. Standard rates adopted for the current year are enumerated in Subpara (d) below. However, prepaid expenditure in earlier years and expenditures for which provisions have been made in this year have been converted at the standard rates adopted for the year of payment.
  - (b) Difference between the actual rupee remittance and foreign currency received converted at standard rates is taken as gain or loss on translation. Any increase or decrease in cash and bank balance (in rupee terms) due to change in standard rate from one year to next year is also treated as gain or loss on translation.

## B. NOTES ON BALANCE SHEET

8. Every member of the Council other than the Officials of Government undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Council in the event of the same being wound up during the time that he was a member or within one year afterwards, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Council contracted prior to the date on which he ceases to be a member and the costs, charges and expenses of winding up the same and the adjustment of the right of the contributories among themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding ₹ 1,000/- in the case of Ordinary Members and ₹ 50/- in the case of Associate Members.

### Fixed Assets:

- (a) As an impact of the policy for conversion of additions/deductions to Fixed Assets (paid/received in foreign currency) at standard rates as detailed under Para 7(d) of the Statement of Accounting Policy, the difference between actual and standard rates of exchange is being charged/credited to Income & Expenditure Account as difference in exchange rate, whenever the actual rate is different from the standard rate of exchange. The policy is being consistently followed for years and hence the net effect of the same has not been ascertained.
- (b) Office equipments include fans, refrigerators, dish washing machines etc. acquired prior to 01.04.1982.
- 10. (a) Secured Loans to employees for house building and purchase of vehicles include cases where mortgage/lien could not be created and hence remained unsecured. The execution of mortgages etc. is pending due to reasons beyond the control of the loan debtors. However, efforts are on to expedite the execution of mortgage/hypothecation.
  - (b) Other Advances in Schedule-B include ₹ 4,91,602/- due from an ex-employee of the Council towards misappropriation of funds in Johannesburg. The Council is trying to recover this amount and adequate provision for loss, if any, will be made after the extent of realisibility is ascertained.
  - (c) Interest accrued but not due on house building, vehicle and computer advances are not taken into account. Interest realised on such loans are, however, accounted for by way of directly crediting the same to "Staff Welfare Fund" account instead of routing them through Income & Expenditure Account.
- 11. The Council is separately maintaining bank accounts (including deposit accounts) in connection with opposing non-tariff barriers, International Price Reimbursement Scheme, Provident Fund, EEPC Pension Fund etc. as a custodian only, which are not forming part of the Council's accounts.
- Provision for Gratuity & Leave encashment have been taken on acturial valuation on the present value of future liability.
- 13. a) The Council is maintaining a Joint Bank Account for making joint payments on behalf of itself and other occupants in relation to the office space acquired in the International Trade Facilitation Centre at Kolkata. As the Council is only acting as a custodian of this bank account, the same does not form part of its accounts.
  - b) The said bank account was opened for the convenience of these occupants in making those payments which are common in nature, such as, premises maintenance expenses, security services, electricity, water supply, lift maintenance etc. The funds required for such expenses are contributed by all these occupants on a mutually agreed basis determined by estimating the amount of expenses likely to be incurred. Since these contributions are being made on an estimated basis, as aforesaid, any short/excess contribution made is adjusted in the accounts of the Council, the year in which the same is determined.
- No provision for Income Tax has been made in the accounts as the Council does not expect any liability on this
  account.

15. Grant received from Govt. of India amounting to ₹ 4,75,00,000 for disbursement to the Exporters under MDA Assistance Scheme has not been treated as Income for the year since the Council only acts as a custodian of the said Grant. Similarly amount disbursed during the year aggregating to ₹ 3,97,99,017 to the Exporters under MDA Assistance Scheme is not treated as Expenditure for the year. The Council has appointed a firm of Chartered Accountants for checking the claim of the exporters under this Scheme before making any such disbursement. The interest, if any, earned on the funds received for making such disbursements under this Scheme is utilized for meeting various administrative expenses e.g. Audit Fees, Bank Charges etc., incurred by the Council for administering this Scheme and is shown accordingly in the Accounts.

# C. NOTES ON INCOME & EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT

- Special contribution from participating members (Schedule "D") represents amounts received towards delegations, publicity, conferences etc.
- 17. The figure shown in Schedule G under the head "Arrear against Revision of Pay" reflects the payments of the balance under this head following the part payment made in the previous year.

- In the absence of confirmation from the parties, various accounts like Loans & Advances, Deposits, Sundry Creditors etc. remain unconfirmed.
