

Mid-year review of export performance

India's exports during April-September 2005-06 are valued at US \$ 43223.52 million (\$43.2 billion) which is 20.52% higher than the level of US \$ 35863.09 million during April-September 2004-05. In rupee terms, the exports were Rs.188659.00 crore, during April-September 2005.06 which is 15.48% higher than the value of exports during April-September 2004-05.

Exports during September 2005 are valued at US \$ 7296.54 million which is 7.51% higher than the level of US \$ 6786.63 million during September 2004. In rupee terms, the exports were Rs.32042.77 crore, which is 2.43% higher than the value of exports during September 2004.

Performance of engineering exports: revision of data

Following an analysis carried out by the Council, it was found that 292 engineering items are not being considered by DGCI&S while computing the data for the engineering sector. This has resulted in understatement of export performance of engineering items. It has been found that these items account for over Rs 3,000 crore (almost USD 700 million) worth of exports which have not been taken into account of exports of engineering goods so far.

The export performance of the sector has since been revised upwards for 2003-04 and 2004-05. The groupwise performance is given below:

Performance during April - August 2005

According to provisional estimates released by DGCI&S, exports of engineering goods in April - August 2005-06 period reached about USD 7 billion. The sector continues to post strong growth, and during the period the growth achieved was well over 30% in dollar terms.

This growth, however, has been led by transport equipment, which has achieved a growth of almost 66% in dollar terms in the period under consideration over the corresponding period of 2004-05. It holds a great significance that the top two engineering items in 2005-06 are transport equipment and



machinery and instruments. This means, the engineering export basket is now being dominated by value added products.
